What you **HAVE** to know...



- The choice of the elective courses is **mandatory**
- You can only choose **2 courses** out of the list the system proposes
- Courses need a minimum number of students to start
- Maximum number of students admitted: 100**
- Some elective courses' lessons may overlap with each other → check very carefully the lessons timetable (at the [Lesson schedule](#) on the Department website) before making your choices to be sure that there is no clash!**

For students going abroad...

Erasmus, Free mover, Summer School

- Students who wish to take **elective courses while studying abroad** in the context of an International Exchange Program, the Free Mover Program or a Summer School and to sit the associated exam must select the general:

"Exam taken abroad" option.

- The exam - if passed - will be included in the student's academic record and the student will be awarded the number of credits that their own degree program specifications attribute to electives.
- It should be noted that it is necessary that courses have already been approved in accordance with the procedures laid down for every mobility program: <http://www.luiss.edu/international>
- Should the exam for the elective course taken abroad not be passed, the student must inform the Student Office of the elective and associated exam that they intend to take at LUISS from among the courses on the list taught in their own Department that are not already full.

- You cannot decide to insert additional courses after the deadline

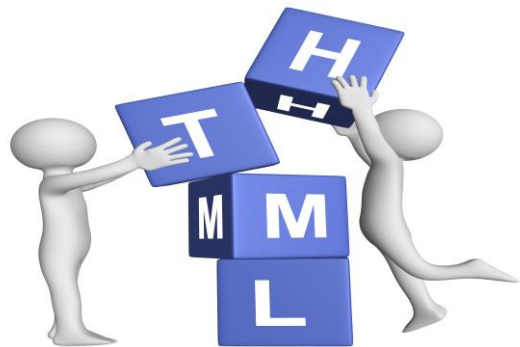
Additional courses What we propose...
